Preparing in joyful Hope and in thanksgiving

This second week of Advent, the Lord, through his prophet Baruch, asks us to, 'take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction...and put on for ever the beauty of the glory from God. Put on the robe of righteousness from God, put on your head the crown of the glory of the Everlasting. For God will show splendour everywhere under heaven...For God will lead...with joy in the light of his glory, with the mercy and righteousness that come from him' (cf. Baruch 5:1-9).

Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

In Luke 1:28 the angel Gabriel, speaking on God's behalf, addresses Mary as "full of grace" or "highly favoured". In that context, this phrase means that Mary is receiving all the special divine help necessary for the task ahead. However, the Church grows in understanding with the help of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit led the Church, especially nontheologians, to the insight that Mary had to be the most perfect work of God next to the Incarnation. Or rather, Mary's intimate association with the Incarnation called for the special involvement of God in Mary's whole life. The logic of piety helped God's people to believe that Mary was full of grace and free of sin from the first moment of her existence. Moreover, this great privilege of Mary is the highlight of all that God has done in Jesus. Rightly understood, the incomparable holiness of Mary shows forth the incomparable goodness of God.

Live in faith and hope, though it be in darkness, for in this darkness God protects the soul. Cast your care upon God for you are His and He will not forget you. Do not think that He is leaving you alone, for that would be to wrong Him.
